Programs and services

Chronic Care Management: Lovelace's CCM program provides essential services between visits to those with chronic conditions, especially in people with multiple illnesses. Advanced technology allows clinicians to proactively identify patients who may need additional help navigating social determinants of health by improving access to healthy food, transportation and affordable medication - issues that can really impact quality of life.

Lovelace Labor of Love: Through this no-cost expecting-mother initiative, members enjoy several programs, such as prenatal yoga classes and 'mommy message', along with continual guidance through the process of finding an obstetrician, assistance with health insurance, planning where they will deliver, and making sure their needs during pregnancy are being met.

G.R.A.C.E., Giving Respect and Compassion to Expecting Moms is available through Lovelace Medical Group and focuses primarily on overcoming addiction to opioids. The program also works with those struggling with use of methamphetamines, cocaine or alcohol. In order to avoid stigma, all patients are presented a simple screening questionnaire at the clinic. Services are identified through a patient survey, and Lovelace works with outside partners to provide assistance needed assistance. GRACE also works with providers to offer medication assistance to prescribe for pregnant women who have been using opioids.
